Activity-55: Interview farmers

During your vacations or an organised school trips talk to Farmers and find out about the different practices and problems of Agriculture.

What to ask a Farmer:

Here is a questionnaire which will be a useful guide:

- 1. For how long or how many generations has the farmer (or his family) been doing agriculture?
- 2. How much land does the farmer own? (area)
- 3. How many different crops does the farmer grow in a single season or a year?
- 4. If the farmer grows only one kind of crop, how many times can he grow them in a year?
- 5. How many times have his crops failed?
- 6. What are his water sources?
- 7. How much does he depend on rains?
- 8. What does the farmer do if there are pests?
- 9. Is the soil quality still good as it was couple of years back or couple of generations back?
- 10. Does the farmer use pesticides?
- 11. Does the farmer use fertilizers?
- 12. Can his crops grow well without using fertilizers?
- 13. Has the use of fertilizers and pesticides improved the yield or have just stabilized it from going down?
- 14. How many people are required to work in his field?
- 15. Does he use any machines in the fields?
- 16. Which crops are very profitable?

- 17. Which crops are very difficult to grow?
- 18. Which crops are very easy to grow but have no profit?
- 19. Which plants are very easy to grow, have good profits? Are there such plants and are they food sources for humans?
- 20. Does the farmer work all round the year? If not what does he do when he not working in the fields?
- 21. ...think and ask more.
